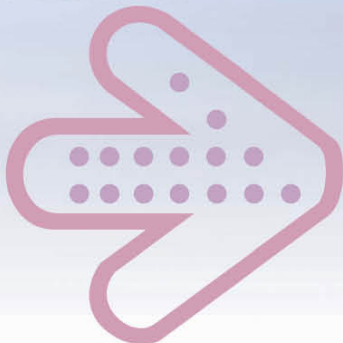

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KCP has proud history as a global leader in the Japanese teaching field since its establishment in 1983. The student enrollment limit is 640. We offer a University Preparatory Course that provides excellent student support with the goal of aiding students in entering prestigious Japanese universities and a General Japanese Language Course that is designed to meet various needs of students.

The annual total of standard class time for University Preparatory Course is 1,000 class hours / year, and that of General Japanese Language Course is 800. By taking elective classes other than the standard classes, you can study up to 1,200 hrs and 1,000 hrs in each course. Co-curricular elective sessions provide students with many extra opportunities to study Japanese and they have been giving satisfaction to many students who study at KCP.

2. Details of the course

This course is geared towards students who have studied less than 12 years in their home country or until they finish their high school education and wish to enroll in Japanese universities.

In condition that the applicants fully complete this preparatory education course they will be given the same eligibility as those who have completed 12 years education.

Please contact the school for details of the course criteria.

In the beginner level class we offer a special curriculum that is designed to enhance students' basic Japanese skills in a short period of time. Intermediate level classes or above will provide English lessons in order for students to prepare for EJU tests and secondary exams for university entrance. Through those classes students will be able to develop skills that will be helpful for them to enter prestigious private or national universities. Staff who are in charge of this course will give detailed guidance to students in order to help them decide which school will best match their interest and to prepare for the entrance exams.

Please note in advance that those who wish to enroll in this course will have to complete a selective exam to test general academic ability.

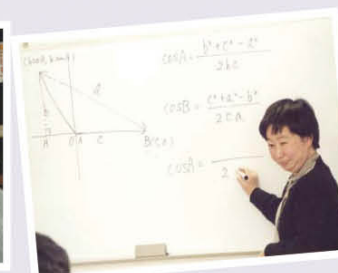

2. Details of the course

This course is for those who have completed their education of 12 years or longer back home and wish to enroll in prestigious Japanese universities.

In the beginners level class we have special curriculum that is designed to brush up Japanese basic skills in short period of time. Intermediate level class or above will provide English lessons too in order for students to prepare for EJU tests and secondary exams for university entrance. Through those classes students will be able to develop skills that will be helpful for them to enter prestigious universities and national universities. Staffs who are in charge of this course will give detailed guidance to students in order to help them decide which school will best match their interest and to prepare for the entrance exams.

Please note in advance that those who wish to enroll in this course will have selective exam to test general academic ability.

Support for proceeding to higher education / Admission upon recommendation / Preparation for university entrance exam

1. Quality support for the students' preparation to proceed to higher education

- The staff will strive towards providing the best advice to students to help them achieve their goal of entering the school they want to attend. Well experienced staff will answer students' questions and provide needed consultations.
- Staff will encourage students until they find a goal that best fits their future plans.
- The staff will collect and provide information about colleges / universities in great detail.
- Students have free access to various kinds of information about universities, graduate schools and technical schools in the school data room. We also have informational materials for distribution if requested.
- We hold independent orientations for students who wish to enter universities and for those who wish to go to technical schools. In an orientation held during spring we will explain and identify the general flow of the process, and in the orientation during fall season we provide more practical details such as how to collect required application documents etc.
- We hold simulation tests 2 ~ 3 times per year with consultations if needed.
- For students preparing for the interview part of the university entrance exams, the teaching faculties with rich experience in the society simulate the interview by asking questions and reviewing the responses.
- Faculties provide various supports and guidance for students such as checking / correction of the application documents and essays explaining reasons for applying etc.
- In order to lift motivation of the students, we invite our graduates to the school and ask them to share their resourceful experiences involving preparation and completion of the entrance exams and also to provide the latest information related to university campus life.

2. Information related to the university entrance

1. Example of university examination subjects

Humanities course: EJU Japanese, General subjects, university's original English test and Interview
Science course: EJU Japanese, Mathematics, Science (Select 2 out of Physic, Chemical and Biology), Essay and Interview
 - **Art College** : Skill test (such as drawing), Writing test, Essay, Interview, Document elimination
- #### 2. Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) July / December
- The test style is scheduled to be renewed in 2010 This test is most popular among all Japanese qualification tests. There are cases that technical schools require applicants to have passed JLPT level 2 as a condition to apply for entry.
 - Some universities use the result of JLPT as information to judge Japanese ability of prospective scholarship recipients. The test consists of the following 3 subjects "Writing & Vocabulary" "Listening" "Reading & Grammar", and the passing grade for level 1 test is 280 out of 400.
- #### 3. Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU) June / November
- This is an exam to test Japanese ability and general academic ability of students who wish to enter Japanese universities as international students.
Humanities course: Japanese, General subjects, Mathematics (Course 1)
Science course: Japanese, Science (Select 2 out of Physic, Chemical and Biology), Mathematics (Course 2)

Scholarship System

1. Consortism Scholarship

Sponsored by: KCP Group

This scholarship is for:

Those who have clear purpose in their study, make consistent effort and are considered a good role model for other students.

Amount of the scholarship: ¥ 50,000 (the amount will be paid once)

The scholarship will be granted 3 times each year, at the schools annual events in May, August, and November.

Number of people who will receive the grant: 30 ~ 40 people per year

2. Study grant for privately funded foreign students

Sponsored by: Japan Student Services Organization

This scholarship is for those who are studying in Japan with the purpose of proceeding to higher education, have financial need for the scholarship and have good academic performance.

Amount of the scholarship: ¥ 50,000 × 12 months

Students applying for this scholarship first need to make application to the school and pass the screening process. The ones who are chosen after the screening at the school will receive a recommendation from the school. The decision of whether or not they will be granted the scholarship is up to the final screening process by the organization.

The number of people who will receive the grant: about 10 ~ 17 (According to the last 3 years data)

Time for the application: Every April ~ May (it differs each year)

3. Kyoritsu International Foundation Scholarship

Sponsored by: Kyoritsu International Foundation

This scholarship is for:

- Students from Asian countries who have a nationality other than Japanese.
 - Students who will be continuing study for more than a year after the scholarship is granted. (The scholarship is granted every April)
 - Those who have financial need to receive the scholarship, good academic performance.
- Amount of the scholarship: ¥ 60,000 × 12 months
The number of student who will receive the grant: We submit 1 ~ 2 recommendations per year
Time for the application: every January
- Students who hold pre-college student status or college student status and are enrolled at the school for a certain period are eligible to apply for any of the scholarships above.
